In November 1940, a Civilian Reception Party (CRP) was formed by Scottish Aviation Ltd., to accept the aircraft delivered from North America and to welcome, feed and accommodate both aircrew and passengers. When the Air Ministry took over the Atlantic Ferry Organisation (ATFERO) from the Ministry of Aircraft Production (MAP) and formed RAF Ferry Command on July 15, 1941, a Trans-Atlantic Reception Party took over the task of looking after the aircraft and service personnel from the civilian organisation. Sqdn.Ldr. J.N Bamford was in Command.

From November 1940, to March 31, 1942, the TRP and their predecessors, handled 533 landplanes as well as 100 flying-boat deliveries. These included;

# 150397 EASTBOUND PROCEDURES

Trans-Atlantic Air Control (TAC) at Prestwick assumed control of Eastbound flights from Bermuda and Gander, East of 30W until 10W. Flights South of 5230N, via Gibraltar and North Africa were controlled by the Overseas Air Control Centre (OAC) at Gloucester. Thereafter the flight came under the Control of the Regional Control Centre and destination airfield. The OAC Centre at Gloucester was the standby for TAC at Prestwick should it be attacked by enemy aircraft.

The major navigation aid for trans-Atlantic flights was a high-powered M/F omni-directional radio beacon, (the "Loch Erne" beacon) callsign "UU7" on 263 Kcs, screened to the East and sited 6nm West of the West edge of Lough Erne at Derrynacross. The inbound Radio Range station "legs" at Prestwick, Silloth, and Blackpool (Squire's Gate) were aligned with this beacon. The inbound Radio Range "leg" at Valley was aligned on Belfast Lough. An NDB at each airfield indicated the "overhead" position. Inbound aircraft could receive the Radio Range transmission from overhead the Lough Erne beacon at 12,000 feet or above.

Thirty minutes before their ETA at 10W, inbound aircraft were to identify themselves on the "Renfrew Trio" of M/F D/F stations on 363 kcs or, to the "Plymton Trio" on 363 kcs, if South of 53 North. Renfrew/Plymton would then advise TAC/OAC of the aircraft identity and position fix.

Aircraft were to hold West of the Lough Erne beacon until instructions to proceed were received. TAC or OAC would then pass the following;

Destination, Number along Radio Range leg to the airfield beacon, Turn to land and Altitude to fly (4,000 feet + 1,000 ft intervals) Acknowledge.

e.g. "QAB - W/T callsign of Destination - QGP - Number - QFM - Height in feet - QSL". Then "QSY" to Destination radio frequency".

When the aircraft arrived overhead the destination beacon, it was to report; Time over "Cone of Silence", Height, Blind or Visual Approach.

All flights were notified to Gander, Montreal, 44 Group, Air Ministry and the Military Liaison Officer (MLO) at 9 Group Fighter Command. Flights were to be so routed that they did not interfere with Eastbound traffic. A Departure Message was sent to the TAC/OAC and the aircraft remained under Departure/Regional Control until 10W. Flights were handed off to Gander at 30W and an Arrival Message was required. Overdue action was taken after one hour. Aircraft were to report, enemy attack, submarines, surface vessels and gunfire. If the flight forced landed in Eire, then the crew were to destroy all documents and the aircraft. They were then to escape.

It was realised that diversions from Prestwick would be required, both due weather, usually strong cross winds on Runway 14/32 at Prestwick, and also when Prestwick parking areas became saturated with aircraft delivered. Both the Air Transport Auxiliary (ATA) and USAAF ferry crews were tasked with continuing these delivered aircraft to Maintenance Units or to their operational bases.

By November 18, 1941, the Primary Alternative airfields for Prestwick had been assigned as Silloth, Squires Gate and Valley. Silloth and Squires Gate were equipped with Radio Track Guides (RTG), aligned on the powerful Derrynacross Radio Beacon in Northern Ireland, while the RTG at Valley was aligned with the mouth of Belfast Lough.

On 18 June 1942, VIII Fighter Command at Grenier Field, issued orders for 49 x B-17 of the 97th Group, 80 x P-38s from the 1st Group and and 52 x C-47s from the 60th Group, to proceed to Presque Isle to be organised into squadrons, each of three flights of two elements, each with one B-17 to four P-38s. C-47s to carry freight.

By the end of August 1942, 164 x P-38s, 119 x B-17s and 103 x C-47s had crossed to England, a total of 386..

920 aircraft attempted the crossing to January 1, 1943. A total 882 reached their destinations, about 700 to the 8th AAF flown by their combat crews.

38 planes failed to reach Prestwick, 29 of which "wrecked" and 9 "lost". Of the 186 x P-38 despatched only 7 failed to reach their destination in addition to the 6 lost of the Greenland icecap. One more was "lost".
