- On Sunday there will be gathering of Scottish Aviation Bulldogs to mark the 50th anniversary of the first flight of a Prestwick-built aircraft.




NEW ANNUAL BOOKS







NEW - Scottish Aviation Pioneers



The latest book in our softback series is at the printers now and we intend to launch it at the Fly-In. The subject this time is Scottish Aviation Pioneers - both the single Pioneer and its larger brother, the Twin Pioneer. Author Chris Hobson takes us through the history and use of the two types, most of whose service in the RAF was undertaken abroad. The Twin Pioneer was also used in a variety of civilian roles worldwide, including passenger and freight transportation and in survey roles worldwide.

Within its 120 pages, we have 134 black and white and 64 colour photographs plus 10 colour side views and three-view drawings. The members' price is £17, for non-members it will be £22.

Air-Britain operates an on-line Message Board to facilitate discussions on a wide range of subjects. These include airfield news - access arrangements, residents' lists, airport hotels or, even, hints on telescope repairs - and announcements of new Air-Britain publications and upcoming events. A recent addition is the section "News of Members", for obituaries and memories.

The Message Board can be viewed by anybody, but to obtain full advantage of all its facets, current Air-Britain members need to register at https://login.proboards.com/register/6893725

As well as being able to get involved in the discussions and download various attachments, such as the Tiger Moth histories, you can set up alerts for new discussions and posts.

To set up the alerts, go to PROFILE, on the top menu bar of the main Message Board screen. Then click on EDIT PROFILE and then NOTIFICATIONS. This will then give you a number of options, including new threads (discussions), posts and

several other categories. You can decide whether to receive these notifications and at what interval: Instant, Daily, or Weekly. Then you will receive e-mails to your in-box, from where you can click onto the link to take you directly to the relevant thread or message.

While the Air-Britain Message Board is open to all subjects related to aviation, our e-mail group, AB-IX is *reserved for research topics*, allowing information-seekers to access the vast pool of knowledge that resides within our membership. Again, entry is for current members only and once registered, you can determine the frequency of e-mail delivery: individual messages, a digest grouping up to 12 messages together, or a daily summary. More details of AB-IX can be found within the AB-IX Report elsewhere in this issue.
